Karl Lagerfeld said "What I like about photographs is that they capture a moment that's gone forever, impossible to reproduce".

This was strongly brought home to me in the presentation that we enjoyed in October on 'street photography'.

I always try to remind myself not to overlook or neglect mundane and commonplace scenes and subjects today because tomorrow they will have become a unique record of a bygone age.

As Robert Louis Stevenson wrote "each a glimpse... and gone forever".


